**Note:** Recently, thank you to Candy Van Zante, I was given issues of the *Sully Chimes*, a monthly newsletter written during the Korean War. The Korean War is a war that is seldom talked of but Sully CRC had several men enlisted. I hope you find this "*From the Archives...*" as interesting as I do as we still have extended families of many of these men in our congregation.

### **Sully Chimes** (This first newsletter is not dated but was apparently written in 1952)

Dear Members of the Armed Forces:

The "Sully Chimes" is a new project in the interest of our soldier boys, it is to be published monthly and will be sponsored by all the societies of our church.

It was brought to our attention when one of our boys sent home a similar copy which his buddy received from his home church. He thought, as we did, that it would be very interesting, especially to the boys in the service, since it will keep them in contact with each other without writing to each one individually. Therefore we got together and got busy, and here now you have the first copy of the "Sully Chimes" in your hands. We would like very much to know how you like it. Any suggestions or improvements in any way would be greatly appreciated, so don't be afraid to tell us all about it.

We know that it will be impossible for every one of you to have a letter in each edition, but if you all do your best I'm sure we can make a success of it. It will mean a lot of work for all of us, but if we can bring a bit of cheer into the lives of each other this way it is well worth while.

We are thankful that we have the assurance that God watches over us all, no matter where we are. That is of great comfort to us all, and we pray that God will spare the lives of all our boys, and that in due time they may return to your home and dear ones again. That is our wish and prayer for you all.

Hoping to hear of you soon, and may God bless you richly. Goodbye until next month.

#### [From the Archives: Letter written to the Sully Chimes in 1952]

Dear Friends,

Just came from chapel a while ago, so I think I'll drop you a letter for the "Chimes". I think this is a splendid idea, and will prove to be a very interesting paper. I hope you are all fine when this reaches you. I'm getting along just fine. I'm not much of a letter writer, but I'll try and give you an idea how things are going over here with me.



I'm here with a Mod. Unit in Korea. I'm stationed at an air strip out side of Seoul. Our job here is to evacuate patients from the lines to hospitals here in Korea and Japan. We're not too busy. I'd say we probably ship out about 75 or 80 a day. The fighting isn't too bad now and that's why we don't have too many. Some of the fellows are hit pretty bad. It sure makes a fellow stop and think. I'm really thankful I have as good a place as I have. We have a pretty good place here. We have these tin buildings and they are pretty nice. The food is good and nothing to complain about. It's a lot better than what we had in the States and more of it too, which suits me just fine. The weather hasn't been too bad yet this winter. It has really been mild for this time of the year. The weather is very nice today. Last week was about as cold as it has been. I know I've seen it a lot colder in lowa, which reminds me I would sure love to be there right now. I'm going on my fourth month here now. I don't think I could ever like it here. These people over here have nothing. I honestly don't see how they exist. Their homes are worse than most buildings we would have on our farms, and the war isn't making it any better. The city of Seoul has sure been knocked to pieces. I don't think there is a large building there that hasn't been hit.

It's about chow time so I think I'll close for now. Here's hoping you're all getting along okay. Take good care of yourself. Good-bye for now and God's richest blessings.



May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope. Romana 15:13 EGV





Emailed received: "I was in El Salvador with my wife's family for the New Year. I met this man briefly as I was driving through a very busy small town called Ataco in El Salvador.




