I will have to close again for now as I don't have too much more news. It is our constant prayer that in due time you will, along with all the other boys, return home safely. Even though we are far separated from each other we can find comfort in the fact that our Heavenly Father cares for His own wherever they are.

From Camp Kilmer, New Jersey, Nelson Geels writes...

Dear readers of the Sully Chimes,

It soon will be time for our letters to be in again, so I'll just get busy now. Quite a little has happened since I last wrote and I find myself quite some distance from Fort Riley.

The trip to New Jersey was quite an experience for me; it being my first airplane ride. We rode above the clouds and had plenty of altitude. It seemed funny to be looking at the big white clouds from the top. We had coffee and dinner on the plane, too. The flight was smooth all the way except shortly before we landed. The clouds had rain in them and we hit some air pockets. About like a roller-coaster only the drop wasn't so far.



The city of New York really is a big one and quite a sight from the air. The trip from the airport to camp was a nice one. Through a tunnel, the highway being a boulevard.

There sure are a lot of men here. When I was at Ft. Riley I thought we had a big chow line, but it was little compared to ours now. The mess hall is six times as big and more, and they have four lines moving which makes it move faster, but it still takes about an hour to handle them.

Today we were in the theater all day. They gave us lectures and showed films. The films dealt with Europe; and also a very interesting one named "Abandon Ship".

At present I don't know how long I'll be here, but by the time you are reading this more than likely I'll be across the pond.

There are quite a few boys from Ft. Riley here now. I just wonder how bad they will split us up.

The weather is pretty warm over here too. It was raining when we got to the airport, but it quit shortly after we got to the bus station. (We took a taxi to the bus station.)

Thanks for all the birthday cards, and the many kindnesses given to me while home on furlough.

Not SHINE-ing but in the Idea Lab!

Well, neither Through Their Eyes nor [TLF](#) met Shine.

But through your prayers, God has been stirring and providing.

And we need continued prayers more than ever! :)

Hence this update to get you up to speed for those continued prayers.

Megan arrived on a Friday for the first Shine workshop - only to learn that it has been canceled. As in, the whole program had been canceled. The plan to follow up the Friday Shine workshops with a reflective space for the women to cement what they were learning through therapeutic photography on the following Monday had now evaporated. We had some quick pivoting to do if we

wanted to offer something meaningful for the women!

The thing about ministry, especially in vulnerable communities, is that you can go in with plans, but if we hold them too tightly, it can send one spinning, missing the real opportunities before us. In TLF's book, *Finding Community in the City: The Story of Many Journeys*, commemorating their 25 years of ministry, chapter one begins:

- "Working or living on the margins, where vulnerable people fight death, where abuse is stealing people's joy, is almost always an entry into perceived chaos. Some people enter our communities and their immediate instinct is to try and create order in the chaos. Then they realize that what they want to organize, will not always allow itself to be organized, and what they view as chaos, is often an opportunity for innovation and rediscovery of the self and of others. In the reality of human pain and suffering the neat order of things is often stripped away. What remains is humanity in all its frailty, stripped to the bone. Sometimes it is dark and shapeless. But, at times, surprise and wonder emerge from the chaos."

With Shine pulling out and other hiccups along the way, things were certainly feeling chaotic. But what was clear was the invitation God had set before us. There indeed was an opportunity for innovation, discovery, wonder and delight in this unfolding process.

So, how has the program taken shape?

Lungile and Manisha agreed they still wanted a program that focused on identity for the women. Which meant that we needed to put our minds together ASAP if we wanted to offer something to the women in three days time. On Monday, Lungile and Megan launched **The Idea Lab**.

We entered with story to transport the women into a world of imagination and hope. When life is dark and shapeless, it can be hard to wonder, celebrate, imagine. We let the book [The Fantastic Bureau of Imagination](#) by Brad Montague usher us into a magical land where untold stories were slipping away. Why a children's book? Stories create a safe distance - between people, between people and their problems. It invites a sense of wondering and delight. Playful atmospheres can help regulate stressed out [nervous systems](#) - activating our bodies and minds in a healthy way while also making space for calm and connection - the best of both worlds. It also gave us a frame for our own storytelling. We were able to explore what keeps us from telling our stories and the importance of telling our stories. Each week, we enter a different department of the book, explore a topic, and the women receive a photo task.

- **Week 1 and 2 = the Department of Wonder!** We explored our identity - the aspects of ourselves that we are proud of, what we want to celebrate ourselves, and what God says about who we are.
- **Week 3 = the Department of Noticing.** We continued to explore our identity as we learned about the sacred design of our emotions using scripture and the [RULER](#) framework. We focused on R U L - Recognizing emotion, Understanding emotion and Labeling emotion.
- This coming Monday, we will enter **Week 4 = the Department of Repaired and Re-imagined Things.** We'll explore the E R- Expressing and Regulating part of the RULER framework. We will look for evidence of strong emotion in scripture, how the Bible advises us, and will focus on strategies for healthy decision making.

- **Week 5, the Department of Dreams and Doing.** We will explore our dreams, both short and long term dreams, and steps required to achieve them. For as the book urges, "we must dream, but we must also do."
- **Weeks 6 and beyond** = we will look at the visual stories we've told so far and begin to refine them. We will add photos or text for missing stories. We will select our favorites and edit the written descriptions in preparation for the workshop and exhibition at the annual [Feast of the Clowns](#) celebration on Aug 26.

For our Idea Lab, please continue to pray that:

- **God maintains the sense of safety and trust that has been established.**
- **That God engulfs us as we dig into the good and hard parts of our stories!** The women are showing ownership of our space in the ways they've helped to decorate our Dept of Wonder and many are sharing vulnerably. But some are still skeptical - why "play" with a camera or spend time telling my story when I have serious problems. It's a valid question!
- **Pray for the challenges our women are facing!** Some of the challenges include: not having work, being separated from the children, being at risk of losing their children, traumatic and violent memories and experiences all the way back to their childhood, pressures and lies from their former lives that tempt them to derail the important work they are currently doing.
- **That the plans come together for each week's lesson.** This was a concern before - but the weekly planning demands have increased! Please pray God continues to guide us as we contextualize our content and develop the weekly lesson, workbook pages and the photo tasks.
- **Pray for Safety.** This community has experienced 3 armed robberies in the last 2 weeks and safety is a concern for all who live there.
- **For truth to shine in the women's lives** as they reconnect with who they are in Christ. It was heartbreaking when on week 3 one of the women was still unable to name one positive thing about herself. When the other women jumped in to name the goodness they saw in her, she could only look down. The wounds are deep. Please pray God brings healing and restoration as the women connect with themselves and their Creator.

We are so grateful for the ways you are holding us in your prayer!
