Today is Sanctity of Human Life Sunday. January 2024 commemorates the 40th year our nation has observed SOHL Sunday. It is an opportunity to focus our time and attention on God's true plan and purpose for each and every human life. Since the overturn of Roe on the 24th of June 2022, we have seen a shift in our nation. While we continue to celebrate the Supreme

Court's decision, this is not the end of abortion or the devaluation of life. This simply turns the legal status of abortion back to individual states. The work of defending the unborn is far from over. Abortion, especially chemical abortion (which now accounts for over half of all abortions in the US), continues to occur. Ministry to the abortion-vulnerable is challenging: it's private and hidden; further, it's been politicized and disconnected from the gospel, discipleship, and grace. Dear God, we can't decrease the number of abortions in a transformative way without you changing the human heart. Please strengthen our church to lead with love and compassion.
