- 6. Pastor Jack and Karen Vanden Heuvel will be with us from late January to the end of April. We look forward to their leadership and fellowship during this time.
- We will hold an Easter Sunrise Service again in 2024.
 More details will be provided as we get closer to the service.
- 8. Nominations for Administrative Council Members, Shepherding Elders and Shepherding Deacons were made.
- 9. We plan to hold our annual Congregational Meeting on Monday, March 25. All necessary documents will be provided to the congregation in mid-March.
- 10. Nolan Vos closed in prayer following the singing of "Make Me a Servant."

It's a year ago this month that this project was started. We will try to do a little reminiscing. Someone brought up the idea of putting out a soldiers paper to keep contact among the boys as close as possible. We wanted to do it, but could we? We decided to try, so a committee was appointed. They organized and each one received some task for which they were responsible. A name had to be chosen, price lists of paper etc., had to be compared and many more things had to be done. Sometimes it seemed as if it was more than we would be able to carry out, but somehow we managed to get the first copy out. We truly believe it was much appreciated.

At that time there were eighteen of you boys in the service. Now our flag has thirty-one stars; this includes four discharged emblems. We hope to have several more of these in the near future.

Next month Nelson Arkema has to be inducted, and last week several of our boys had to have their pre-induction physical examination. Before long they too will have to go, and so it will go on. Some must leave and say goodbye—and others can be greeted with. "Welcome Home". Unless we know of the sorrow in parting we cannot appreciate the joy of meeting again—we will look forward to that happy time for each of you, D.V.

John Huyser must leave for Korea after his furlough is spent at home. How we hate to see our boys go there, but we know that God is not confined to time nor place, and He will care for His own, whether they are in Korea, Japan, Europe, in Camps in the US, at home, or anywhere else.

It seems as if our boys are pretty well scattered all over the world. We wonder what difference it will make in your lives. Will God use some of you to work in His vineyard in a special way, as a result of the experiences you are having? We hope so.

Hello and greetings from Germany. Best wishes for the New Year. Permit me to go back a little and I'll tell you how we spent the holidays. Thanksgiving we spent at Grafenwolks. They have ranges up there and we fixed our weapons and ran sound problems. We were there for a good week. Christmas and New Year were both spent here at Smith Camp. On each of these holidays we had turkey and just a lot of good things to eat. We had services both Thanksgiving and Christmas.

At present the snow is all gone. It's a little colder out now than it has been.

This past month I had the happy experience of meeting someone from back home, namely, Edwin Van Kampen. I saw him for a few minutes here in Giessen and then the following Sunday I looked him up in Frankfurt. We had a swell time. The last time I saw him before this was at Camp Crowder, MO.

Practically all of December was spent in Giessen. This month (January) we're supposed to go to Wildflecan for about seven days for some winter training. Then in February we're supposed to have "Operation River Crossing". And that's just what it is — crossing a river. Can't say I look forward to that such a whole lot.

Four successive days sometime before Christmas we fed and gave some German orphans a good time in Mess Hall no. 1. Four and five bus loads a day. They collected for it one payday. It sure was a pleasure to see those happy faces of the children. Good-will such as that was expressed throughout Germany as well as elsewhere.

That's about it for this time. Once more may I wish you all a Blessed New Year. So-long.

The community survived a major disaster in March that destroyed homes, businesses

and lives. God is healing the area, and our hearts delight in witnessing the progress of therebuild. So many new homes and businesses are emerging, and families are beginning to return home. At Cary Christian Center, we must be sure to make known to you just how grateful we are. In the midst of despair, God's glory is shown faithful!

About 52 years ago, this ministry started with Dr. Peter Boelen's vision to provide health care to an impoverished rural area in Mississippi. Most of you may know the story. Though great enough in itself, what developed from that vision was the opportunity to plant seeds of God's love that would change thousands of lives for years to come.

The ministry is respected as a trail blazer in reducing the infant mortality rate in the state of Mississippi, as well as improving the health and well-being of

citizens for whom quality provision was not afforded. Cary grew to provide dental services. and people from around the world were given an opportunity to partner in this great work by sharing their time, money, and supplies. But what just may be God's greatest gift of all through Cary Christian Center is the extension of His loving hand investing into His people's lives for decades to follow. You see, the ongoing work of this ministry is carried out as hearts are touched...one volunteer, donor, community or staff member at a time. As many are led to give of their time and resources to the work, those who are helped receive what is needed, and are also led to share. In thankfulness for the impact these partnerships have on them, many are excited to give back....

These are just a few of many lives that proclaim the "good deeds" of the Lord through Cary Christian Center. I, myself, began as a mother in Cary's

parenting classes in 1983. He praised God for sending a couple who are now permanent residents on one of Cary's RV pads. In addition to renting a space, the family saves the ministry thousands of dollars

by maintaining the grounds and volunteering in the Village children's program.

Carl is a native of Cary who, as a child came through the Cadet/Little Brothers program at CCC. He has a tremendous heart for ministry and love for people and the community. He believes that, "like the church, Cary Christian Center is also a place where people go for healing and restoration." Carl is most grateful for the opportunity to be a part of the beginning of the lives of the children who attend the Bible classes and afterschool tutoring. He recalled for me several times when the lives of family members were impacted for Christ through building relationships with the children and adults participating in the ministry. "I am here to serve!", Carl excitedly told me as he described himself as an "introvert who loves people!" He feels called to serve and be a resource to others with the many gifts God has given him. As a result, many in the community are comfortable to approach Carl, giving him the opportunity to assist with meeting their needs whether through goods and services, offering words of comfort, or simply being an ear for those needing to talk.

In his work as CEO of the ministry, Carl quickly noted that it is not a job for him, but rather a chance for him to labor alongside of others in Community Outreach ministry work. "Sharing and making a difference in people's lives without being perfect is what Christ would want us to be doing!"

Although Carl received drafting technology training in college, he recently received a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, and is interested in Christian Counseling. 
