

- 1. Chairman Dale Van Wyk opened the meeting with devotions and prayer. The needs of many in the church and community were lifted in prayer.
- 2. Financial information and reports were reviewed. The general fund balance is at about \$175,000 with an additional \$100,000 in an 11 month CD.
- 3. Classis Central Plains will hold a classis meeting on May 16 at Cornerstone CRC in Pella.
- 4. The Hospitality Committee has coordinated a variety of meals and events in recent months with more activities planned throughout the year.
- 5. The church roof replacement has been completed using insurance funds.
- 6. We have agreed to a short term extension of our insurance policy with Grinnell Mutual; however, we are also searching for new insurance coverage.
- 7. The council approved the compensation package offer to Pastor Darren Kornelis.
- 8. New council members were assigned to care groups and the installation service is planned for May 26.
- 9. Kyle Van Kooten closed in prayer following the singing of "Give Thanks."

IN MEMORIAM... Clara Hoogeveen

It was on October 24,1927 that Fanno and Tana Van Hove welcomed a new baby daughter into their home. They named her Clara. She was baptized in the Emden Christian Reformed Church near Renville, Minnesota, and received her education in this area. It was here that she was united in marriage with Stanley Hoogeveen. They became the parents of five children.

Our community was introduced to Clara when Stan became the principal at the Sully Christian Grade School. She was a devoted wife and mother who found time to work at the Sully grocery store and in the Christian School library. She enjoyed doing handwork such as knitting and embroidery. She baked and cooked and loved making coffee time treats and Sunday dinners. One day her chocolate pudding was lumpy and they kidded her about having chocolate chips in her pudding. Her grandson Jeff, who was a basketball player who had just lost a ballgame, gave her a big hug and said, "It's just a game, Grandma- just a game!" That was one special hug. Clara faithfully followed all of her grandchildren's activities. She and Stan spent much time traveling and camping all over the U.S. and Canada. They enjoyed watching the eagles below the Red Rock dam. Clara struck me as a very special wife, mother, and grandmother.

Those left to cherish her memory are her children: Linda and Terry Zylstra, the late Carol and Wes Van Wyk, the late Steve and Connie Hoogeveen, Phil and Barb Hoogeveen, and Michael and Brittany Hoogeveen, along with thirteen grandchildren and a number of great and great-great grandchildren, with other relatives and friends. She was preceded in death by Stan, Carol, Steve, two grandchildren, her parents and several other relatives.

Funeral services were held at the Sully CRC with pastor Jack Vanden Heuvel officiating. Darwin Van Wyk, Tara Fransman and Emily Vande Griend provided the music. Grand-daughter Tanya sang "My Jesus I Love Thee." The congregation also sang several numbers, and "The Hallelujah Chorus" provided a fitting conclusion to the service. Pallbearers were grandchildren and interment was at the Sully cemetery.

Memorials were designated for the Sully Christian School library and Megan's memorial.

As a congregation, we will remember Stan and Clara as servants of our community and the Lord, and we extend our sympathy to the entire family.



Dear Christian Friends.

It is already the fourth of the month, and I neglected writing the past two times so I'll have to get busy and get a letter written this time before it is too late.

I am now on the tenth week of training, the worst is past which is the first eight weeks. I'm now in the second week of the tractor scraper course which is an eight week cycle.

This camp is quite the place for weather variation, yesterday it was a balmy summer day. Today it was chilly and rained most of the time, it has been that way most of the time I've been here, except the week we went on bivouac. It was nice all week until Saturday morning. When we moved back to the Company area we had three inches of snow.



As for the Chapel services here, they are fair. Some of the sermons don't carry much spiritual food, but on a whole they aren't so bad, its mostly what a person is used to, I guess.

The Young Calvinist Club here isn't too large a group, but at least it is one place where a person gets to talk to someone of your own denomination, and discuss the Bible, and in a way that makes you feel at home. There were eighteen at the meeting yesterday. None of us had our new Calvinist yet so we just had a song service, and a social meeting afterward.

This is all I have for this time. So until next month, may God bless and keep His own, may we place our trust in Him.
