Every girl that attends our GEMS program is Special and Loved! Every one has gifts and talents and personalities in the person that God has created her to be. We value each and every one.



Dear friends,

**Change is part of life**. Children grow to be adults. We move to a different home. We change jobs. We all have experienced change.

Jeannie and I have experienced our share of change. We have lived in at least 14 different homes. We have lived in three of the states of the U.S. We have lived in the United States and Nicaragua. Now we live in South Korea. I (Joel) have had four or five significant career changes. Each of you could tell your own story of change!

There have been studies of the stages of cultural adaptation. These stages could be applied to almost any change, including changes of location and job. The stages are:

- Honeymoon phase: Excitement and fascination with the new situation.
- Crisis period: This is where excitement turns to disappointment and there are more and more differences that occur.
- Adjustment phase: This is where we learn to accept the new context and negative attitudes begin to change to positive ones.

Acceptance and Adaptation phase.

**So, in which stage do Jeannie and I find ourselves after eight months in Korea?** Hmm, thanks for asking. I think we are in the *Adjustment phase*. The *Honeymoon phase* has mostly passed. We have both experienced some disappointments, even crises. Cultural differences have become more marked. But we are adjusting and learning! God is good! We are thankful for the privilege of serving Him in this time and place - and with these particular people!

For me (Joel) it has been a gradual realization of my role. Frankly, when I agreed to be principal, I had little idea of what was expected of me. I saw myself as accompanying Jeannie in her role of starting a kindergarten. I wondered if the school simply needed a missionary pastor as a figurehead for promotional purposes. That would have been fine with me. I have since learned that when the school asked me to be principal, it really wanted me to be principal!

I have also learned that the role of a principal has a lot of similarities to that of a pastor of a congregation. In many ways the teachers, students and parents of Grace Christian School have become my congregation. There is the same need for spiritual and pastoral leadership as I would have experienced if I were pastoring a congregation. There are similar challenges informing a Christ-centered community made up of imperfect humans (including Jeannie and I!). If I had imagined this to be a part-time retirement job, I would have been sadly mistaken!

**Jeannie** has gone through a similar process. Jeannie came to Korea with a very definite idea of how the Little Lambs Kinder should be organized. Jeannie is by nature very organized. She likes to have her lesson plans finished weeks if not months in advance! She found that the Korean culture tends to be more focused on the urgent and the immediate. Her Korean staff has not always been on the same page as her with respect to routines and boundaries for students. Like me, she has been adjusting!

And through it all we are so grateful for God's faithfulness. This past week Jeannie held an "open class" for parents of the Little Lambs students. The parents were amazed at the progress their children are making in English! On the same day, I was pleased to see our primary school students involved in a community service project. Each day there is something that reminds us of why we are here.

## Praise and Prayer

- For the rapid progress the Little Lambs Kinder students are making in English. Young minds are like sponges for language!

- For our plans to be in the U.S. during the month of July. We will be in lowa for the 100th birthday of Joel's Mom and will spend time in Michigan and Texas with family and friends.
- For the series of teachings on Christian worldview that Joel is sharing with the parents.
- For wisdom in the pastoral issues that arise in both the school and the Little Lambs Kinder.




Email received— 12-31-2023

"Hello ladies and gentlemen, hello my brothers and sisters, my name is kantché Adjovi Faipa, I am in the Agoè district in Lomé, the capital of Togo in West Africa. I had the great pleasure of receiving the

tricycle last week from your partners on site here. Honestly, I don't know how to express the feelings of joy and gratitude that overwhelmed me when I received the cart. I say simply and from the bottom of my heart thank you, thank you, thank you... Since my old cart is spoiled and it has become definitively impossible to repair it, I have now become doubly handicapped, because my job consists of traveling the city over long distances (especially party squares) looking for plastic bags and cans for recycling. For almost a year, it has been my three children who have been doing this work for me if they are not at school (the oldest is an apprentice). In short, with this cart, I fully regain mobility and my activities. I say thank you once again and pray that God will repay you a hundredfold.

Attached you will find some photos of me in the cart. Thank you so much."






From Africa Surgery:

James was crippled by polio as a child. He had worked hard his whole life as a blacksmith. Now, retired and with no wife or children, at age 58, James lives at a small shelter for the disabled, in Freetown, Africa. Africa Surgery in Sierra Leone gifted James this Mobility cart. The cart will get him around safely.

This is one of 70 carts shipped to Sierra Leone by Africa Surgery.





BrightStart and Mobility Worldwide are like -minded, committed partners, and this project is an exciting extension of both of our current ministries. BrightStart will launch a vocational training center in Battambang with technical support

from Mobility Worldwide. This project represents BrightStart's first opportunity to provide vocational training to the marginalized population in Battambang who are in desperate need of job skills. BrightStart will be able to offer relevant and certified vocational programs featuring metal fabrication and welding. God has opened doors and provided joyous surprises as we've embraced this new adventure together. BrightStart students will begin receiving formal instruction in metal fabrication and welding to provide mobility carts to leg-disabled people in Cambodia.

## If You Say It, Do It!

It is easy to say, "I'll be praying for you." Too easy, sometimes. One of the alerts I remember from my early pastoral training is about promising to pray for people. We were warned not to let those words too easily flow from our lips. To this day, that advice affects me. I rarely say "I'll be praying for you" unless I am determined to do so. It is an important issue. If the promise is going to have strengthening power in itself, it must come from a sincere and committed heart that will follow through. Otherwise, the words are destined to become a mere salutation or a farewell, meaning little.

Being prayed for is an enormous gift. Those who pray conscientiously put time into their supplications. They exert energy. They think about the situation and the need. Their hearts are heavy with concern and love. To offer this is a wonderful gift. To be offered prayer should be thoughtfully appreciated. A warm, moving and grateful response is an appropriate way to say thank you.
