Dear friends,

Three months ago, on a snowy Thursday afternoon in March, we launched a hastily formed capital campaign that laid out the huge opportunity we had been given when our landlords offered to sell us our building. We also were faced with the monumental challenge of trying to come to a purchase agreement with them by May 1, and then extended to June 1 to reach their asking price of \$2,000,000. We communicated over time that this transaction was critical to the ministry of the Table, present and future. In fact, the reality was that for the Table to continue we believed the ownership of this property was essential. And so, for the last three months we've been working to communicate with and invite as many people as we could to partner with us to reach that goal.

Unfortunately, we fell short of our financial goal and were unable to reach mutually agreeable terms to purchase this property. We are extremely disappointed by the outcome and its implications not only for the Table Public House, but also for the work of the Table Urban Farm and Table Community Church. As a result, we have made the difficult decision to wind down the operation of the Table Public House, concluding operations on June 30. We will have a celebration of life weekend on the 29th and 30th, with a closing ceremony at 5 PM on June 30.

What that means yet for the ministry of the Table and all its arms is unclear. The last 13 years have been the source of countless and untold stories, effort, successes, failures, challenges, and joy. And with the clear message that property ownership is not to be at this time, we sensed that it is also an opportunity to take some time to wonder what God may have for the next chapter of our lives and ministry.

We are certain that this news is received with confusion and concern, as well as possibly some relief. You have supported and prayed for this unique ministry for over a decade. This decision has not come lightly but rather with the input and support of our board and countless hours of discussion and prayer. And we invite your support and prayers as we pause to rest, recover, and listen for what new doors will be opened to us.

To that end, some of you made donations for the purpose of purchasing this property. We understand that donations made for a specifically solicited purpose may be returned to donors at their request. So, if you would like your

donation for that purpose returned to you, please let me know by July 31. We will mail you a check (minus any applicable processing fees) for the amount donated for this purpose. However, if you are willing, we would like permission to utilize your donation for the liminal space we are about to enter, providing space for our family to consider what is next.

Please allow this brief letter to express our deep gratitude for all the ways you have supported us and the ministry of the Table over the last 13 years. We say it in every communication, but without you we could not have experienced what we have over that time. We are truly humbled and thankful for you.

Please don't hesitate to reach out, and thank you again.

Table Public House Update

Some people love roller coasters. On the other extreme, some people get sick because of them. The process we've engaged in to try to buy the Table Public House has been a roller coaster. In late June we mailed an update that we had fallen short of our fundraising goal to purchase the building. We closed operations on June 30 with a truly amazing community event at which we experienced the depths of the impact we've had in this space. It was a tremendous celebration of life while simultaneously full of grief.

Two days prior to the closing event, our landlords called to say that they were willing to negotiate the price after all. That conversation produced a price we felt we could work with. A recent board conversation has led to a resurrection of hope. With the roller coaster in full force, we are once again actively working toward a purchase agreement that will enable the Table Public House to reopen, and the active work and ministry of the Table Urban Farm and Table Community Church to continue to grow.



20+C+M+B+24 Marked Doors and Open Doors

If you visit The Table Public House, you might notice the doorways are marked: 20+C+M+B+24. It has been our custom every first Sunday in January to pray and place a blessing over the house, all its doorways that represent the different activities and people groups that find a place at The Table. A Farm Update

Will The Table Urban Farm continue? We believe so. As uncertainty spread in recent weeks, notes of sadness and gratitude came pouring in. Just this week a farm partner wrote, "We will really feel the hole in the next summer, and I don't know how I will fill that void."

This summer our farm has 10 community partners we launched to grow with us for the community. With the help of the community, we also grow on 4 big plots and invite the volunteers to join us in growing, learning and sharing the harvest. Veggie Bike has taken a pause this summer, and we are sharing directly from our gardens. Any excess food is shared with our closest food banks and community recreations centers.






Discerning the Table Public House Future

Here are the ways you can help us reach our goal and own the building outright:






